

Summer Reading Program 2025

“Level Up at Your Library”

June 1 – July 5



The goal of the Summer Reading Program is to keep our young patrons reading during the summer. Participants can fill out a reading log, earn prizes and attend fun shows. The program is FREE and is for children 12 years old and under.

How to Use the Reading Log:

*For each 15 minutes of reading time, color in 1 circle (see log). Write down the books you read from that week. An adult should review the log and sign each completed week. Bring logs to the library each week to get stamped and get a prize. If all circles are filled in by the end of the program (July 5), your name will go into a drawing for Holiday World tickets and free pizza. Adults may read to children who are not reading independently.

Logs must be turned in at the library by the end of the day on July 5 to be eligible for the drawings.

Live shows – Thursdays at Lawrenceville High School (see show schedule)

- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
- ***Children are expected to be polite and to follow instructions of the staff or performer. Our goal is to provide quality entertainment that encourages reading and the use of the library.***
- Doors to the meeting area open 30 minutes before each performance.
- Please see schedule for show times.
- Children attending the program will be eligible for special weekly drawings.

Earning Prizes

- **Children who are registered for the Summer Reading Program will receive a small prize each week when they come to the library to get their log stamped.**

- Readers who meet their goal of reading for all five weeks are eligible for drawings for free pizza and the grand prize drawing of 2 tickets to Holiday World, one winner per family.
